Public Health Museum

The Public Health Museum is a non-profit educational and cultural museum dedicated to preserving artifacts and records of our nation's history in public health. The Museum also serves as a resource to the community educating and promoting public health initiatives that address current health issues.

The Public Health Museum located in Tewksbury, MA, is housed in the Old Administration Building of Tewksbury Hospital. Tewksbury Hospital was established in 1852 as a state almshouse to care for the poor which included a growing number of immigrants.

The City of Boston and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts are rich in history, but few know the integral role they played in the development of Public Health. As early as the 1700's, Boston, serving as the first line of defense against smallpox, held ships quarantined in the harbor to protect the general

Directions & Parking

The museum is located in the Old Administration Building of Tewksbury Hospital, at 365 East Street in Tewksbury, Massachusetts. 978-851-7321 ext. 2606

From Route 93: Take Dascomb Road exit West toward Tewksbury. Dascomb Road becomes East Street. Just past the intersection of Livingston Street and East Street, you will see the hospital on your left. Take the first driveway on your left onto the hospital grounds.

From Route 495: Exit 38 south to Tewksbury. On Route 38S, follow signs to the hospital and museum just beyond the police station at the Town Green. Turn left at the set of lights in the town center onto East Street. Approximately 1 mile down East Street on your right you will see the Old Administration Building on your right. Pass this building and take your next right onto the hospital grounds.

Park in the first or second parking lot you will see to the right. The Museum is housed in the building just beyond the Chapel.
